OLEO EUROPAEA – 'SWAN HILL'



| Origin: | Discovered in an orchard near Swan Hill Victoria, where it was a 20 year old tree that had not fruited |
|--------------|---|
| Habit: | Small stature, erect or spreading, evergreen tree with a rounded or vase shape. 7m x 7m |
| Description: | Foliage grey/green. Inconspicuous flowers in spring producing virtually no pollen. Fruitless. Bark is, pale grey until the trees are very old and the wood is strong and durable |
| Tolerances: | Drought and a wide variety of soil conditions. Performs poorly on sites with strongly compacted or waterlogged soils. |
| Notes: | Foliage is sparse enough to allow some winter light through. Long lived. |
